



UNITE Inc. Privacy Policy

This statement explains the information we collect and what we do with it.

UNITE collects identifying information from its members, from other annual conference attendees, and also collects information about prospective members from them, from public information sources, and from UNITE members.

The identifying information includes your address, telephone number, email address and employer. We also may collect information on your areas of interest, types of computer systems, software tools, and application software used. In most cases, you give us this information yourself, in person, by mail, by email, through conference registration or through our web site.

UNITE will not trade, rent or sell your personal information to anyone.

We use the information collected to contact you to provide information about UNITE activities, to solicit your opinions about UNITE conferences and other UNITE services, to deliver information about UNITE conferences, and to render services that you may request.

UNITE publishes the list of annual conference attendees, including contact information, and distributes that list to attendees at the conference. You can opt out of this list publication when you register for a conference.

Certain federal and state laws may require us to divulge information about you or we may be required to disclose information subject to a court order. In these circumstances, only the specific information required by law, subpoena, or court order will be shared.

If you prefer, you may direct us not to contact you and to remove you from our mailing and other contact lists. This can be accomplished by the following methods:

UNITE cannot guarantee that the information you provide to us is completely safe, although we are careful to try to prevent problems. There may be technical problems beyond our control that may make it accessible to unauthorized persons.

If UNITE is acquired or merges with another user organization, our member information will be included among the assets transferred in the transaction. There also may be occasions on which UNITE is required to provide information by order of a court or when the law requires that member and user information be treated as a transferable asset, as in bankruptcy.

Internet-based communication is dynamic and changing. We may change our privacy policy in the future in order to adjust to these changes. We recommend that you check it frequently.
